About the University

The Maharaja Sriram Chandra Bhanja Deo University (formerly North Orissa University), accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC, was established by the Government of Orissa, under Section 32 of the Odisha University Act, 1989 (Act 5 of 1989), vide notification No. 880 dated 13th July 1998. It was carved out of the Utkal University and became operational since 1999 at Takatpur (98.84 acres) of Baripada in the Mayurbhanj District of Odisha as an affiliating university. The University is recognized by the University Grants Commission under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956 with effect from 15th February 2000 and 21st June 2006, respectively. The territorial jurisdiction of the university extends over Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar districts of the northern part of Odisha, thickly populated with tribal communities. MSCBU's jurisdiction covers 110 colleges (Mayurbhanj-68 + Keonjhar-42) including 3 Autonomous Colleges, 2 Law Colleges, 1 Medical College, 3 Teachers' Education (B. Ed.) Colleges (including one for physically challenged) imparting education to a large number of students at the graduate and post-graduate levels. MSCBU is recognized by Bar Council of India, DEC, IGNOU, NCTE and included in the list of Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth Universities.

About the Department

The department of Anthropology and Tribal Studies was established in 2001. Initially in 2001-02, M.A. in Tribal Studies course started in self financing mode. Then the course was renamed as M.A/M.Sc. in Anthropology and Tribal Studies from 2009-10 academic session. M.Phil and Ph. D in Anthropology and Tribal Studies is introduced from 2010-11. The department has been regularized from academic session 2021-22 with five regular faculty members having specialization in socio-cultural, biological and archaeological anthropology. Presently, the M.A./M.Sc course is having 30 seats out of which 06 seats are reserved for biological science graduates. Pre-Ph. D and Ph. D programmes have been introduced in 2022-23.

Concept Note

The tribal people of India with specific reference to Eastern India are now passing through a process of rapid transformation. They have been adversely impacted by the rapid process of globalization, industrialization, urbanization, and the like. The recent rapid technological advancement and unrivalled economic and political strength of world capitalism have created conditions for the invasion and extraction of natural resources from tribal areas of Eastern India. The penetration of market economy and the ongoing process of industrialization resulting in massive deforestation and resource depletion have completely destabilized the economy of these underprivileged and marginalized people. These have irretrievably mutilated the indigenous knowledge and distinguishing socio-cultural cognitive framework of the weaker sections. In this backdrop the seminar aims to bring in scholars from various disciplines of Eastern India whose work addresses the state of tribal transformation and development issues in the region.
