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

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Alumni Association of Berhampur University: A Brief Report

In the month of January, 2016 informally alumni association was formed. However, the University formally established a committee for the Alumni Association of Berhampur University (AABU) under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor, BU in 2018. The first Alumni meet was held on 27.12.2018. Later, different committees for the association were constituted. During June and August 2019, a draft bye-law was prepared. The first meeting of the executive body of the association under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor was held on 12.12.2019. In that meeting, the bye-law was discussed, amended, approved and termed as the Constitution of "Alumni Association of Berhampur University. It was also decided to award one or more proficient Alumni as Distinguished Alumnus of Berhampur University on 'Foundation Day' of the University each year. On 2nd January, 2020 on the Secretary, AABU occasion of the 54th Foundation Day of the University, Sri. Satya Sundar Tripathy, UNO Assistant Secretary General, New York, USA was conferred with the 1st Distinguished Alumnus Award. Subsequently, Prof. Ashok Kumar Mahapatra, Vice-Chancellor, Siksha "O" Anusandhan University, Odisha and Prof. Arun Kumar Pati, Harish Chandra Research Institute, Allahabad were conferred with the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2021. In the academic year 2019-2020, around 14 PG departments have organized their corresponding alumni meetings. Many of the alumni have assured to extend their co-operation to the association for conducting various academic and developmental activities. It was planned to conduct a grand alumni meet of AABU in the month of May 2020. However, due to Pandemic Covid-19, it was postponed.

The draft constitution of the Association was also approved by the syndicate of the university on 12/10/2020. The 2nd General Body meeting of the association was held online on 21st November, 2020. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic it was decided that the same EB body and office bearers will continue for another one year. It was decided to conduct a webinar on "New Education Policy -2020". Later it was conducted on 25th February, 2021. The association received donations and other contributions from different alumni members. The association is taking all necessary steps for the registration of the association under Society Act

Webinar on "New Education Policy 2020: Issues and Challenges"

lo create awareness about new education policy His message was quite strong and loud that these among the students and faculty members of ideas are implementable, if the teaching Berhampur University as well as other alumni members, a webinar on "New Education Policy 2020: Issues and Challenges" was organized by the Alumni Association of Berhampur University (AABU) on 25th February 2021. For this event eminent personalities from different field across the country were communicated. However, Prof. Arun Kumar Pujari, Professor Emeritus, Mahindra University, Prof. K V R Chary, Director, IISER, Berhampur, Prof. Deepak Kumar Behera, Former Vice-Chancellor Sambalpur University, and Prof. Govinda J. Chakrapani, Vice-Chancellor, Berhampur University consented for the event. Prof. Prakash Chandra Mishra, President, AABU presided the event and Prof. Manas Kumar Patra moderate the event. After introduction of invited speakers all the dignitaries have shared their views regarding the New Education Policy (NEP).

Prof. K V R Chary spoke on the focus of NEP in terms of Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability and Accountability. He also touched upon the challenges with regards to funding, infrastructure, and evaluation system.

He emphasized that these ideas were already there in some form or other in different parts of the country but now efforts are being made to implement that in the national level.

Prof Govinda J Chakrapani raised certain implementation issues at the ground level which need to be addressed for smooth implementation of NEP. While he appreciated the flexibility of students acquiring credits by undergoing courses at the institution of their choice, he also shared his idea about teachers from ITs and other Institutions of repute visiting colleges and Universities across the country for offering teaching courses.

Prof. Deepak Kumar Behera highlighted specific implementation challenges because of the digital divide across the country. He talked about the National Technology Forum which is being formed to address the technical requirements for the new mode of blended education. He also spoke on the preparation needed to move ahead with the NEP.

There were around 297 participants registered for the event. More than 100 numbers of registered participants joined the event. From the audience Prof. G. S. Tripathi, Prof. R. K. Mishra and others raised some important issues regarding NEP. The invited speakers clarified all the raised issues. At the end Dr. Narayan Sahoo, Secretary, AABU summarize the events and gave vote of thanks. Historical Background

The Alumni Association, Department of Zoology, Berhampur University, has been established in the year 1994 by former Professor Late Dr. R. Prasad with the basic objectives to unite the past and present students of the department in a Reunion Function every year during the Annual Day celebration of the Zoology Seminar, to extend financial and moral help to the needy members of the Association, to encourage the present students in their academics by instituting different prizes and medals, to felicitate members retiring from their active services on superannuation, and to give ovation to the members for their outstanding contributions in the field of Science and to the society at large. In order to focus the activities of the association and to highlight the achievements of its members, a bulletin is published every year since 1996. The logo with the figure of the Hippocampus at the centre with the name of the Association written around it in a circle (prepared by Mr. P. Venu Gopal) was adopted in 1995being made to implement that in the national level.

General Body/Executive Body

The General Body shall meet at least once a year in the Department of Zoology, Berhampur University, preferably on the annual day of Zoology Seminar. Sources of Income

Current Status



Professor Prasanta Kumar Misra and the Golden Decade

Professor Prasanta Kumar Misra joined as the first full Professor of the Physics department and consequently it's Head of Department in late 1973. At that time I was studying M. Sc. Physics in the Final year. He taught us Solid State Physics special paper. Before joining Berhampur University, he was already a full professor at the University Engineering College, Burla, Sambalpur University. Prior to that he was a Reader in Physics at Utkal University, Bhubaneswar and Lecturer at Ravenshaw College, Cuttack. He did his Ph. D. at Tufts University, Boston, USA working under the mentorship of Prof. (Mrs.) Laura M. Roth, a renowned expert in theoretical magnetism. Later he joined as a Visiting Research Scientist at the University of Texas, Austin and worked with the renowned electronic structure theorist, Professor Leonard Kleinman, one of the originators of the very popular Pseudopotential Theory in the area of Electronic structure of Solids. By the time he joined Berhampur University, his Ph. D. and Postdoctoral works found mentions in popular text books like Solid State Physics by Ashcroft and Mermin and Quantum Theory of the Solid State by Joseph Callaway. My association with him became stronger when I joined as a Research Fellow in his Major Research Project "Properties of Solids" and started

Working on the magnetic properties of narrow-gap semiconductors in May 1975. From the very beginning, he showered his affection on me as an elder brother. He was extremely hard working. He used to come to the department at about 9 AM and would work until 10 PM in the evening, with a couple of hours for lunch break and evening snacks. All his research students and later all his colleagues in the department followed this routine. Gradually the routine induced many other teachers of the university to follow suit. Thus began a very vibrating research atmosphere in the university.

My first two years were spent in formulating a problem and developing a methodology. After finishing some analytical calculations, I needed the computation of the same for results. At that time we did not have a Computer in the university. Therefore I used to spend extensive periods at Bhubaneswar to use a small IBM computing facility there. For more complicated calculations we used to go to IIT Madras to use a larger IBM machine. At that time the input was through punching cards which were fed to the CPU for output. Thus my research involved a lot of time, away from Berhampur. In the beginning of 1980, Prof. S. D. Mahanti of Michigan State University, East Lansing, USA spent two months in our department. Prof. Misra advised all his research students to take advantage of his visit and interact with him for improvement and refinement of our respective research works. It was a very hardworking period for us. However, it also became very fruitful for a few of us. We had successful collaborations with him and published good research papers leading to Ph.D. Degrees.

Thus I was exposed to two brilliant physicists of repute Tata Institute of Fundamental Research. Almost all during my Ph. D. work. It was an extremely struggling period and Prof Misra shared every bit of that struggle with us. The training I received from him stood at good College also came for the event. He was a great stead at later parts of my research career.

I obtained my Ph. D. degree in Physics in 1982 and later joined as a Postdoctoral Research Associate at the University of Hyderabad. I joined Berhampur University as a Lecturer in Physics in 1984. Before I joined my dream post of teachership in my Alma Mater, Berhampur University, he left for USA to join a Visiting-Professorship at Temple University, Philadelphia and subsequently at Louisiana State University and University of Rhode Island until 1988 when he decided to take voluntary retirement from the last couple of years he had some health Berhampur University and settle in USA. He joined as a problems. His sad demise is a great loss for all his Professor of Physics and Dean of Natural Sciences at admirers, relatives and friends. I particularly shall miss Mesa State College (later University), Grand Junction, him forever. He would always be in my heart and Colorado.

He worked at Berhampur University from 1974-84. This period witnessed intense research activities not only in the Physics Department but in other departments as well. I consider this period as the golden period of Berhampur University. Many people who did Ph. D. in this period went to USA, Europe and Japan for their postdoctoral research. Few dedicated leaders developed a Culture of Research here and Prof. Misra was prominent among them. The culture was not confined to science departments alone; many faculties from Humanities stream also had the privilege of expanding their horizons.

During his stay at Berhampur, many people benefitted from him. He was extremely social. He lent support to many students pursuing their dreams. When the university lacked infrastructure, he organised a Winter School in collaboration with a premier institute of India,

Thus Prof. Misra led an active life almost until his death on 27th January 2021 at Houston, USA. During guide me as usual as my conscience.

Memory of my Alma Matter during its formative years

 S ometime during the mid of 1966, few young The quality education I received due to the students of Khallikote College, Berhampur arrived at Ratha Pada in Surada town of Ganjam District and had a public meeting. I was studying in class 8th at Sashi Bhusan High School in the town then. They appraised the curious audience how important it is to have a University in South Odisha, the most neglected region in Higher Education at that time. Being so young, just 12+ years old, did not understand what a University is, however, participated in the rally for the next two days moving around the streets with placard demanding a University, and was happy when news came about establishment of Berhampur University on 2nd January 1967. This unprecedented student's agitation in Odisha, first of its kind till date, lead to birth of this great institution where I had the opportunity to study in Khallikote college (1970-1974) under the University, and later at the Post Graduate Department of Botany up to Ph.D. (1974-1980) in it's campus at Rangailunda. Being from a rural area, 8 Km from Surada without Motorable road, electricity etc then, and son of a marginal farmer with weak financial background, if the University would not have established at that time, might have been unable to receive higher education.

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dedicated teachers at our times made me empowered to carry out long term post doctoral research at Germany through DAAD fellowship and at Japan receiving JSPS fellowship, could get a teaching position at Utkal University, Vani Vihar (1987-June 2009), Visva-Bharati Central University, Santiniketan (July 2009-2019) and also as the Vice-Chancellor of Fakir Mohan University at Baleswar (May 2014 to July 2017), a Public University in our state. The environment of the great institution of higher learning in southern Odisha taught me how to work with head high under extreme adverse conditions one has to face upon working away from one's own place, and contributed to quality teaching and research to the best of my capacity.

By the time I joined as pre-University student at Khallikote college in 1970, the 3 years old University was functioning in few rental buildings in between MKCG medical college and ITI in Berhampur. After 3 years when I was a student of B.Sc. Honours, the University moved to its own campus at Rangailunda. Being the secretary of the Botany Department seminar, I went to the campus first during late 1973 to invite Professor Harihar Patnaik, the HOD Botany & Chairman, Post Graduate Council, also was the first OSD of the University and later became Vice-Chancellor of BU (1982-1984) to our seminar function. I also attended the annual function of the student's Union at the campus in March 1974 which is still fresh in mind. Dr. Harekrushna Mahatab was the Chief guest, and the function was followed by melody party of "Habib and his group" most popular in Odisha at that time.

campus that though secured first position in first class in Botany Honours, did not apply elsewhere and joined BU for post graduate course. In July 1974 stepped to its campus as a student and never looked back.

At the time of joining, there was only one hostel (later named as Rushikullya hostel) and one research scholar hostel (Jogendra hostel). The adjacent Hostel no. 2 was just new. Temporary electricity and water connection was given and we were admitted, all in single rooms. Most students in the hostel were from Parlakhemundi, hence were always together. We only two were from Khallikote college and rest were day scholars. Hence I became close to almost all the students who were from other regions of Odisha, mostly from Khurdha, Puri, Cuttack, Dhenkanal and Baleswar districts (only 13 districts in the state then), and was their guide, also mentor advising and giving tips how to live in Berhampur adjusting to the new environment for them. There were only few buildings at that time; one impressive administrative block housing a SBI and post office, one science block where Physics and Chemistry Departments are now existing. Botany Dept was in the first floor in the left side and Zoology in the right. Below Botany was Chemistry Dept and Physics was in the ground floor in the right side. There was one Arts faculty building housing Political science, History, Economics, English, Odia, Mathematics, Journalism and Labor & Social welfare Departments and the Chairman, PG Council Central office. There was a small one floor building of the Student's Union opposite to Arts block and a canteen to its back. There were two tea shops and one tiffin shop in the shade of a banyan tree which was the central place in the campus up to which point the buses were plying.

I was so impressed with the environment in the There was one Ladies hostel, nearby three rows of independent Professors and Readers quarters; two rows of non-teaching quarters and 2 rows of lecturers flats on opposite side of a road leading to the Guest house on the top of a small elevation. Most exciting was the University had 2 white colour elegant looking buses with the emblem engraved on it, which ply several times up and down from the campus to the city and back primarily meant for staff of the University, however, students could use those on weekends for picnics and field visits. Two road trains, two buses joined together with an engine in front used to ply from the city to the campus where students and day scholars commute. Every day there was a bus from the city bus stand to the campus at 9.30 pm which the resident students and staff use to return from city after marketing and visiting films in Vijaya, Utkal, Jyoti and SSBT talkies, only four functional at that time. In total about 200 students and 70 staffs were staying in the campus. All the four hostels had their own mess, hence, no shops were open after the evening. The University becomes vibrant soon after the buses and road train arrives until those leave after 5 Pm, and the residents were left in a calm atmosphere which lead to development of a strong bonding among the students and also with teachers residing in the campus. The air strip was open without boundary which used to be our sitting place, gossiping, interacting and looking to the open sky in solitude. The campus was full with Casuarina tress. The cool breeze and whispering sound mixed with the refreshing sound of the waves from nearby Golapur-on-sea was clearly audible at night still fresh in mind. Many a time we in a group used to walk up to the sea in solitude, 3 km away through Kamapalli as there was almost no human

Kamapalli while I was a student, and I remember we different parts of Odisha and also from other states visited the movie first shown there in which the hero was Rajanikant, the Tamil superstar. It was a Telugu movie.

Even as a student of science Department, I had the opportunity to interact with all, irrespective of the Department/faculty, and could know the beauty and strength of all subjects of science and humanities while staying in the campus during its formative years.

I passed M.Sc. Botany in 1976 securing first position in first class and awarded University Gold medal. It was We had a dramatic society in which I took part made of real gold and is still in possession of mine under the guidance of Prof. Harihar Patnaik through later. However, I can strongly vouch that we had a strong research culture during our time. In most last to leave was Prof. Murthy of Chemistry; after which we used to leave the lab. This had an impact on my life although as a teacher cum researcher research environment at BU during our time lead to opt this as the career option and never changed to go abroad for further research, teach the next generation to get empowered contributing to academics in our state.

> I could not contribute much to my Alma matter after my Ph.D. in 1980 and had to leave unwillingly. Destiny took me to Utkal University in 1987 and then at Santiniketan in 2009 as a teacher, however, renewed contact with BU after 35 years after joining as a Vice-Chancellor of another state University in 2014. I observed a sea change after stepping to the campus after more than 3 decades. Now there are many buildings, additional Departments, extended guest house, Auditorium, several hostels for students, both for Gents and Ladies, air strip with a boundary, a VCs residence on another mini-hill top, few temples, a deer park but missing the cool breeze of Casuarina groves and solitude experienced during our student days.

I may be wrong as I am longing for this of my generation which might not be relevant at present, however, am impressed with its all round growth of its journey through half a century with NAAC "A" grade. I was delighted to participate in the Golden jubilee celebration and had the opportunity of delivering a lecture. Many of my class mates during PG of 1974-1976 batch joined the University as teacher and contributed to its development. They are Prof. Jayanta Mohapatra, Prof. Bishnu Choudhuri, Prof. Laxmi Rout, Prof. Ashok Panigrahi, Prof. Amiya Parichha and Prof. J Sesagiri Rao. Few of my seniors who were also doing research during research career (1976-1980): Prof. Gouri Tripathy, Prof. Trinath Sahu, Prof.Nirmal Sahoo, Prof. Ramesh Choudhuri, Prof. Brahma Panda and Prof Malay Mishra also joined as teacher and contributed. I was not so fortunate to serve the University and had to leave in August 1980 to contribute elsewhere. However, as a son of Ganjam in the southern Odisha, never made my Head down because of my training at BU. While receiving Samanta Chandra Sekhar Award for Research by Odisha Bigyan Academy in 2000 at Jayadev Bhavana, Bhubaneswar, Reporter of Dharitri News paper asked me "who is behind to your success to whom you will give the credit for this state award?". My reply was " to the Adverse situations I faced in life, and to Berhampur University where I learnt how to overcome it". I did not give the credit to my parents or my spouse but to my "Alma Matter". Hence I, as a proud Alumni, wish to see this towering Institution to excel in Academics, in Teaching, Research, also solving problems of the society and curve a niche for itself in the state, country and at the global level.

I had the opportunity of seeing and working in more my ears and are still guiding me through difficult than one University very closely, and Berhampur University is one among them. I learned a bit of commerce and accounting from Prof. Prakash Chandra Mishra, retired Professor of Commerce, Berhampur University on our journey back to residence at Chatrapur every day.

I am one of those fortunate who has the distinction of being a student and a colleague of Late Prof. N. C. Mohapatra, whose life and discipline significantly influenced me. Two incidents which primarily speak of his generosity and professionalism are worth mentioning. Berhampur University in those days was giving the best research scholar award for outstanding research scholars. One of my friends and now colleague at the University of Hyderabad, Dr. Saroj Panigrahi then was pursuing his Ph.D. in mathematics. He was and also is an excellent researcher and had many good publications. Prof. Mohapatra was heading the committee for selecting the best research scholar award. Just a few days before the committee met for this, Saroj had a bitter argument with Prof. Mohapatra concerning some computer center issues concerning his computational tasks. Prof. Mohapatra was then the Director, Computer Center, and Saroj went to him with a complaint and had a very ugly discussion. Many felt that though Saroj had good publications, he does not stand a chance due to his showdown with Prof. Mohapatra. The meeting started, and Prof. Mohapatra supported his case right from the beginning. Out of curiosity, I asked him how he is supporting him after that incident.

I don't find anybody more suitable than him this year as far as research publications are concerned. If this award is for the best disciplined and well-behaved student, I would have opposed the case. We should know the mandate of the committee and respect his research work". This incident taught me how to be professional, focused, unbiased, and do the job with the utmost integrity.

I had an opportunity to work under the able leadership of some great vice-chancellors. Prof. J. K. Baral was one of these distinguished personalities who provided the much-needed academic leadership to the University.

One day Prof. Bhavani Rath (whom I always adore as a mentor and elder brother) and I were doing some confidential work in the examination section. We were getting delayed. Prof. Rath was a little worried regarding his return to Berhampur (he used to stay at Berhampur). We came to know that the Vice-Chancellor has some meeting at Berhampur in the evening and will go a little late. Prof. Rath sent a message to VC's office that when VC goes to Berhampur, he can go with him. Prof. Baral was happy to accommodate him. Most unusually, Prof. Baral got a bit delayed and left in a hurry for Berhampur and forgot about Prof. Rath. After going around 5 km (at Dura-Pathara junction), he remembers and got down from the vehicle and asked Sudhir (his driver) to go back to the University and bring Prof. Rath. Sudhir came back, and Prof. Rath went in the VC's car. When he went near the Dura-Pathara junction, he found Prof. Baral, Vice-chancellor of Berhampur university, standing on the roadside waiting for Prof. Rath.

His reply was, "Saroj is a good researcher that is Prof. Rath felt a little embarrassed and told Prof. Baral that he should have gone ahead with the Baral was humble and humane as well. His response was (1) you were doing University work, and Lagreed to drop you at Berhampur as I am going there. I forgot, and so I sent the vehicle back. (2) When asked about why he stood at the roadside for so long, his reply was, I am going for a meeting, and it is a bad omen to return. He said that I decided on a middle path where tsent the vehicle to get you, and I also did not return to the campus. This is rare that a University's vice-chancellor cares so much for a colleague who is doing the university work beyond office hours. It is heart-touching to note that he did not mind standing on the roadside in the dark for almost 20 minutes to ensure that his colleague does not suffer. This particular incident has a lasting impact on me as a human being, which I always feel like emulating.

It is a great pleasure and a sacred opportunity for me to write some reminiscences of my Alma mater, Berhampur University. It is difficult to choose a particular piece of my memory from roughly half-acentury long association with this temple of learning. However, when I try to reflect on some of the best days of my life, the period that first comes to my mind is from 1976 to 1980, during which I lived in Jogendra Hostel in Bhanja Bihar.

In India, the role of research in promoting the objectives of higher education received prominent focus during 1970s. By the middle of that decade, funding agencies like UGC and CSIR offered liberal research scholarships in all academic disciplines. Berhampur University took advantage of this policy focus and trend. The best students of the pass-out batches of 1974 through 1976, who were willing to do research, were selected/nominated as Research Scholars by the then visionary learned teachers and administrators of the university. Their involved research study and interaction with the supervisors warranted an exclusive accommodation within Bhanja Bihar. So the smallest hostel of the campus having ten 3-seated rooms was earmarked as the residence of the researchers.

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The hostel has been named after Sardar Jogendra Singh, former Honourable Governor of Odisha and Chancellor of the University as it was built from the funds donated by him. After my Post-Graduate examinations, I had left the First/Main (now known as Rushikulya) Hostel in December 1975. Having passed with the Gold Medal of the batch, I was asked by my revered teacher-guide and Head of the Department Professor Bibekananda Das to join as the UGC Junior Research Fellow in Economics, which I had gladly accepted and re-entered Bhanja Bihar. This time I became an inmate of Room No. 4 in the ground floor of Jogendra Hostel during July 1976 and continued to live there for four years.

This is considered as the golden age of the University, which was represented by well-known brilliant teachers, worthy researchers and noble human beings like Prof. P.S. Radhakrushna Murty (Chemistry), Prof. Prasant Kumar Mishra (Physics), Prof. Chandi Charan Das and Prof Bhabendra Kumar Patnaik (Zoology), Prof. Harihara Patnaik (Botany), Prof. Gopal Chandra Rath (LSW), Prof. Bhramarabara Jena (Political Science), Prof. Bibekananda Das (Economics), Prof. B. C. Roy and Prof. K. Majumdar (History), Prof. Chintamani Mahapatra (Journalism), Prof. Nanda Kishore (Mathematics), Prof. Benimadhab Padhy and Prof. Sudarshan Acharya (Odia), and many others. My co-researchers of other departments and coresidents in Jogendra Hostel included Dr. Gouri Sankar Tripathy and Dr. Trinath Sahu (Physics), Dr. Markandeswar Panda, Dr. Chelli Janardan and Dr. Bhabagrahi Das (Chemistry), Dr. Ramesh Chandra Chaudhury, Dr. Surendranath Padhy and Dr. Suresh

The supervisors and scholars formed a unique community of well-wishers and admirers in Bhanja Bihar. Irrespective of the discipline, all the teachers knew almost all of us by name. This was partly due to small size of the institution then, but mainly because of our visibility through our struggle for career. In fact, a forum, named as the Berhampur University Research Fellows Association (BURFA) was making our presence felt in the campus. The University administration provided conducive support to the gold standards of research set by the supervisors and sincere efforts of the scholars. As a result, the research atmosphere of Bhanja Bihar during late 1970s was highly productive. By early 1980s, Berhampur University produced the first batch of young doctorates, who later on significantly contributed to the society in their respective fields of service.

Jogendra Hostel had all the requisite features to facilitate the needed symbiosis within the research ecosystem of the University. The hostel provided rest and recreation to the residents, who used to work in the laboratories and research desks for 14-16 hours or more on a day. It ensured availability of food, including morning and evening tea, from a neverstopping palatable mess. Since there was no job guarantee after research and also as many of us had preferred dynamic research career to ad hoc teaching positions available in the government and private colleges, the struggle situation of all of us was more or less similar.

But the research process was quite challenging and uncertain. The scholars had to really work hard in the absence of photocopiers and computers. Thus the similarity of our future world views brought us together and built a mechanism of sharing and comfort in Jogendra Hostel, which was necessary to sustain the spirit of research. In fact, the hostel was our shock-absorber, which used to refresh and motivate us for the next stepforward. Thus Jogendra Hostel, one of the smallest buildings of Bhanja Bihar, enormously enriched the University through its resident researchers of late 1970s. It has also made significant contributions to our own lives. Not only our subsequent economic position was built here, but also with so many good friends Jogendra Hostel made our social sphere quite rich during this life.
